CLEVELAND, Tenn. (June 10, 2009) – On Tuesday, June 9, 2009, People for Care and Learning and partnering organization Men and Women of Action, along with Dr. Luke Queen, Executive Director and CEO of Bradley/Cleveland Services, dedicated a new covered driveway named in honor of the late Tyler Carver. Through a \$25,000 donation provided by People for Care and Learning, a construction team from Men and Women of Action built the covered driveway that shelters community members from the elements.

Bradley/Cleveland Services is a community-based agency that has served the needs of adults and children with developmental disabilities since 1973.

Speaking on the day of the dedication, Dr. Luke Queen said, “The grand structure is a monument to sacrifice, dedication and love for people. Individuals with intellectual disabilities are blessed every day to be able to enter our facility under the protection of this impressive entrance.” Queen continued, “We have named the new structure the ‘Tyler Entrance,’ given in honor and appreciation to Hugh Carver’s son who left us one year ago today.”

Tyler Carver, a student at Cleveland High School, passed away on June 9, 2008. One year later, his memory is still strong in the hearts and minds of those who loved and knew him. Carver’s classmates tied notes of remembrance to the branches of the trees along the Greenway across from the school on the anniversary of his death.

Hugh Carver, Director of Men and Women of Action, and father of Tyler Carver, said, “Working on this project at Bradley/Cleveland Services was such a rewarding experience. Seeing the joy on the faces of everyone who pulled up under the covered driveway as the rain was pouring down was worth it all.

“Tyler had a tender heart for those in need. This is a beautiful way to remember his life. For me, it was an honor to partner with People for Care and Learning and Bradley/Cleveland Services in providing this new entrance.”
